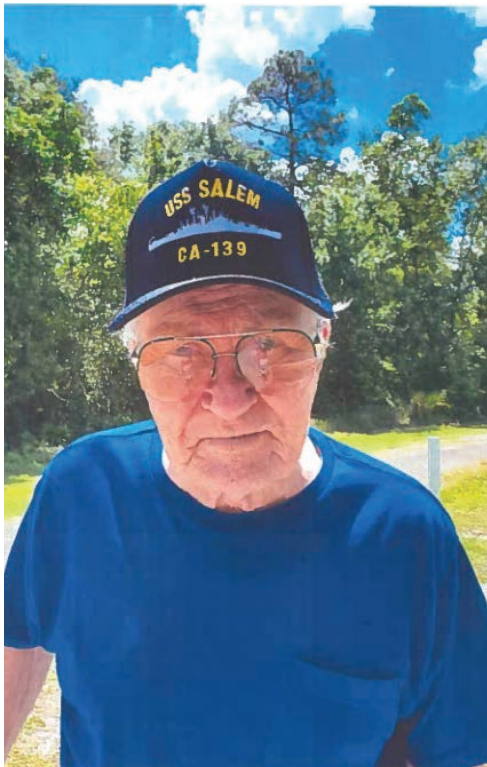

St. John Street Neighborhood and Bill Orling Paintings Discussion Panel and Reception

Wednesday, September 27 • 6 PM

Flint's St. John Street Neighborhood was a thriving multi-racial community until it was demolished in the early 1970s. The policies that gave precedence to industry and I-475 resulted in displacing many Black residents who lived in the neighborhood.

A panel of former residents and leaders will discuss the impact and the subsequent struggle for housing experienced by so many in the community. After a discussion, attendees will be invited to view the paintings of Flint artist Bill Orling on display in the Library's Lower Level. Orling received the Heritage Award from the Genesee County Historical Society in 1978 for his ability to artistically capture the beauty and diversity of Flint's neighborhoods.

60 Years of the Birmingham Campaign for Civil Rights

This year, 2023, the City of Birmingham commemorates sixty years since the Birmingham campaign for civil and human rights. As a part of the commemorative events, **The Historic Bethel Baptist Church Community Restoration Fund of Birmingham, Alabama, is pleased to announce its conference on individual and community healing.** The conference theme: *“There is a Balm in Gilead: Healing From The Events of 1963.”* The conference will take place September 12-14, 2023 in Birmingham, Alabama.

Christopher Paul Curtis discusses his book, *The Watsons Go to Birmingham-1963*. His presentation at the conference, *“There is a Balm in Gilead: Healing From The Events Of 1963”*, is organized by The Historic Bethel Baptist Church, in Birmingham, Alabama, to commemorate the 60th Anniversary of the bombing of 16th Street Baptist Church in Birmingham, Alabama, as referred to in *The Watsons Go To Birmingham-1963*, wherein four girls were killed and 17 other injured during Sunday school, by a bomb planted by the Ku Klux Klan. What happened in 1963 changed not only the city, but inspired similar movements for human and civil rights across the nation and around the world.

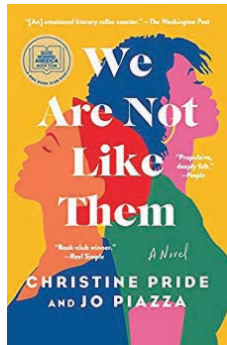

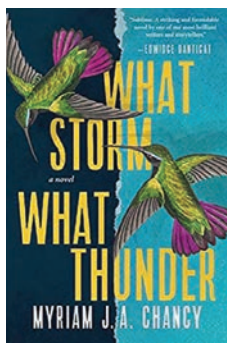

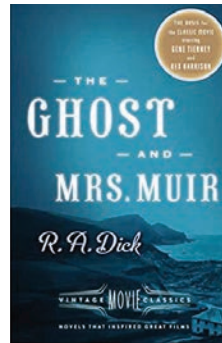
