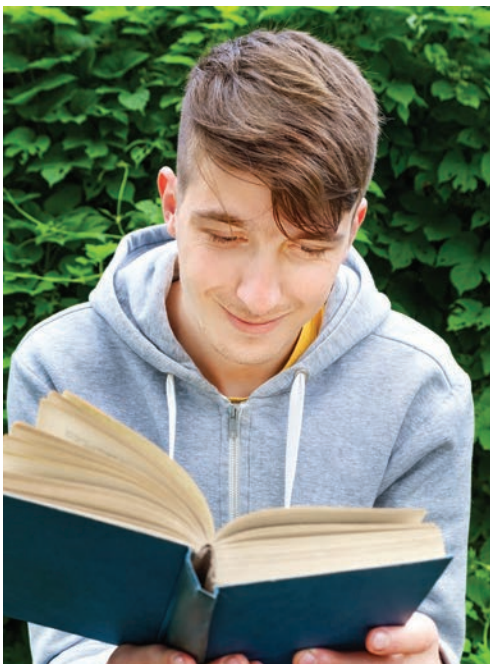

July 20 Terrific Turtles of For-Mar

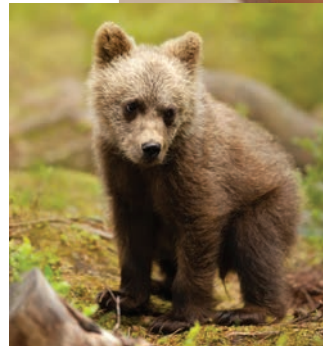
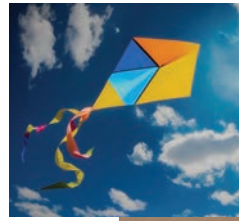

Saturday, August 5 • 9:30 AM

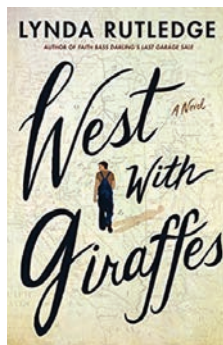

Stonewall Uprising

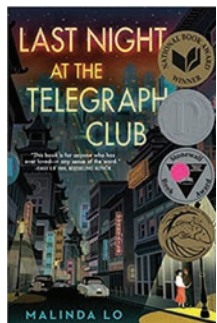

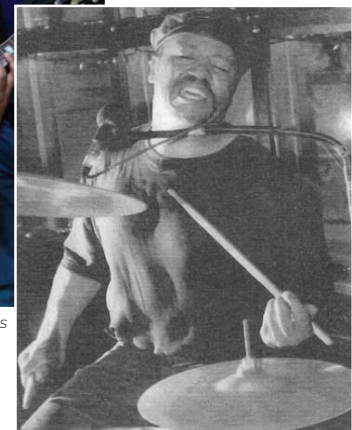
