## Our Genealogy Collection



The Flint Public Library is home to the second largest open stack genealogical collection in Michigan. The collection started with a gift from the Daughters of the American Revolution in 1905 and focuses on New England, New York, Michigan (in particular, Genesee County) and the Province of Ontario.

The collection includes a large number of Michigan county histories and Michigan cemetery readings. The Library has copies of all filmed Michigan Census returns as well as many for New York, the New England States, Missouri, Arkansas and the Province of Ontario, Canada.

The Library is also home to one of the largest open access collection of materials on Genesee County, collecting local school yearbooks, directories for the City of Flint and Genesee County, local publications, histories of local churches and Synagogues, city and village histories.

This collection is NOT online at this time! You must visit the library to use it, or see our web site for how to request obituary research for a fee.

You can use the Flint Public Library Online Catalog to search for books related to genealogy and local history in our collection either within the library or from home. Try a keyword search using terms such as "city directory" or "census."
