TAX VITA: Volunteer Income Tax Assistance March 2, 9, 16, 23

Registration begins at 9am and ends when slots are full. VITA volunteers will provide income tax assistance to those with low to moderate incomes (\$50,000 or less) filing 2018 tax returns. (No itemized deductions, business income (self-employed), or capital gains transactions).

Bring proof of income (W-2, 1099, SSI benefits), proof of identity (driver's license or state identification), and proof of Social Security number (Social Security card preferred) for every family member being claimed.

Homeowners **MUST** bring their 2018 property tax statements for BOTH winter and summer property taxes to claim the property tax credit.

Those who purchased health insurance through the Healthcare Marketplace and received advanced premium payments **MUST** bring Form 1095-A.

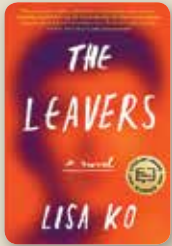

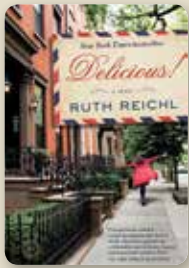
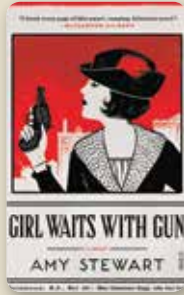
